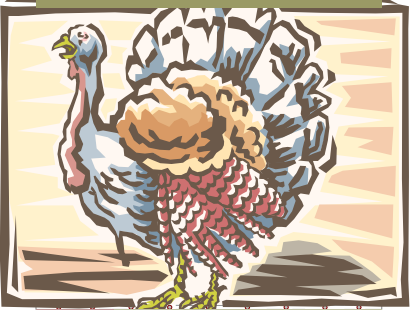
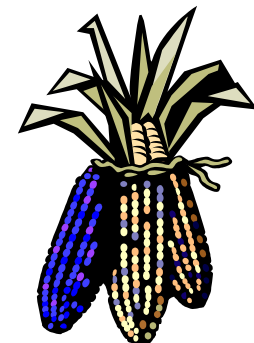


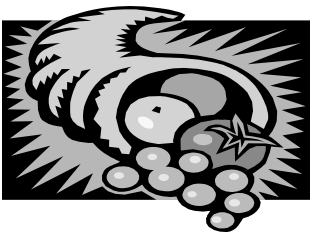

TURKEY TALK



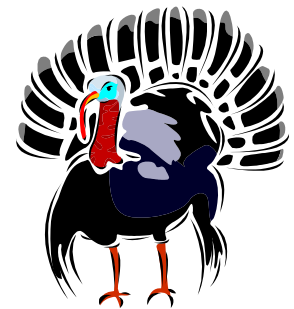
It is estimated by the National Turkey Federation that 90% or 225 million Americans eat turkey on Thanksgiving.

LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

Winter and those winter snows will soon be upon us. This means that we need to discuss snow removal issues in our buildings. The number one issue is that each and every person who has a car in the parking lot of the building needs to move it when it snows. I understand that many of you have a hard time with this but you need to find a way of addressing this issue. The specific time for when the cars need to be moved varies from building to building depending on the snow removal contract. If you have difficulty in moving your vehicle you may wish to consider some alternatives such as putting your car in storage for the winter or hiring someone to move your car when it snows or to depend on a friend. It is your decision and it is your responsibility.

The reason I need to be so adamant on this issue is that a parking lot that is not clean is a serious safety hazard to everyone who uses it. It is impossible for the snow removal people to do their job if there are vehicles in the lot. It is also important for you to understand that if I have to call the snow removal

people back because someone did not follow the rules it costs additional money. The money can be spent on snow removal or on something that is more pleasurable like new appliances or carpeting.

I also want to remind everyone who parks your car with the nose of the car over a sidewalk to make sure they do not let their vehicle extend over the sidewalk when it begins to snow as it also makes it difficult to shovel. It is important for everyone to cooperate on this snow removal issue and remember----- only 5 months until spring.
